

# Stanway Quarry Fiveways Fruit Farm Extension

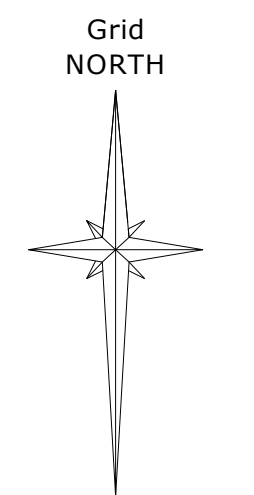
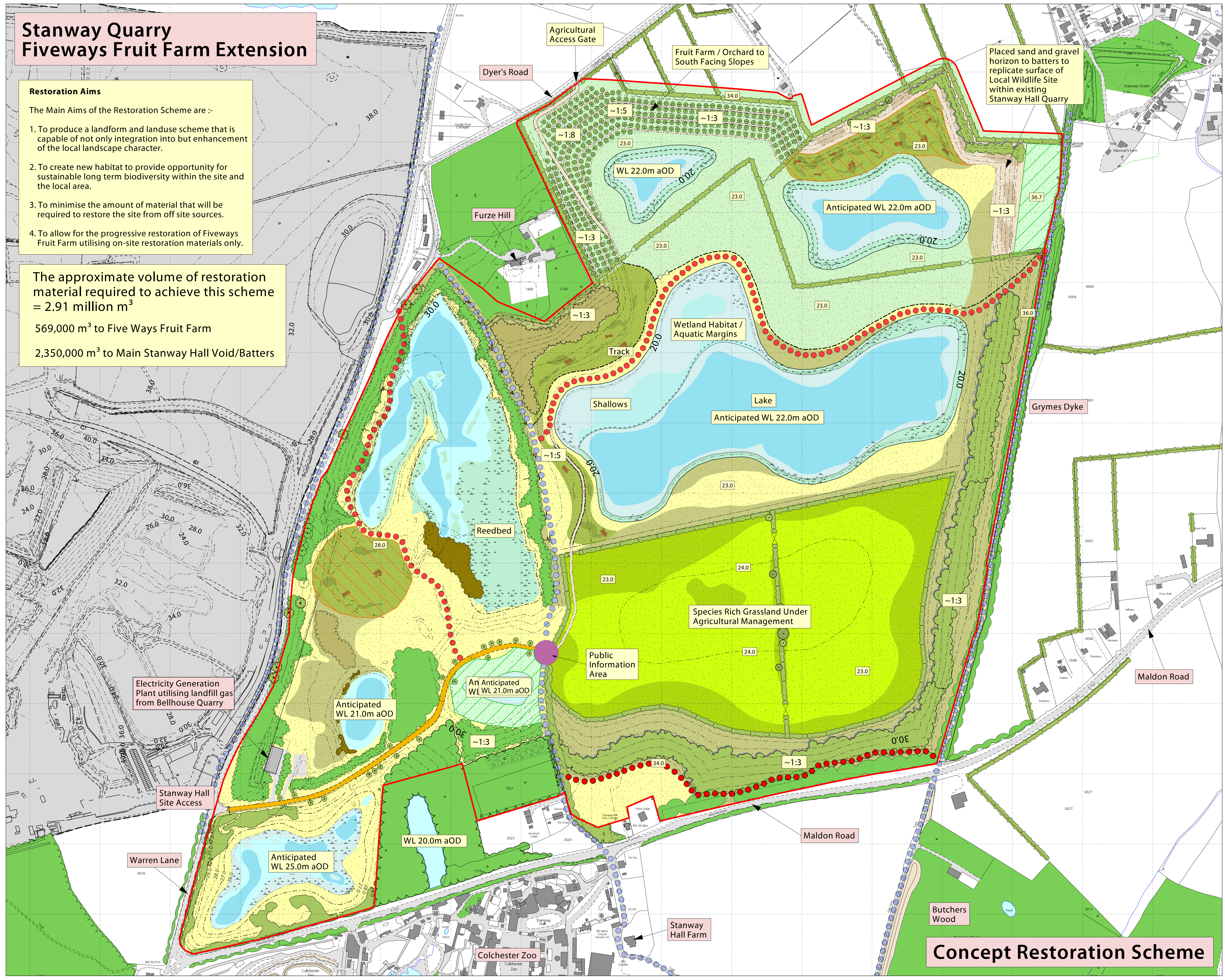
**Restoration Aims**

The Main Aims of the Restoration Scheme are :-

1. To produce a landform and landuse scheme that is capable of not only integration into but enhancement of the local landscape character.
2. To create new habitat to provide opportunity for sustainable long term biodiversity within the site and the local area.
3. To minimise the amount of material that will be required to restore the site from off site sources.
4. To allow for the progressive restoration of Fiveways Fruit Farm utilising on-site restoration materials only.

The approximate volume of restoration material required to achieve this scheme = 2.91 million m<sup>3</sup>

569,000 m<sup>3</sup> to Five Ways Fruit Farm  
2,350,000 m<sup>3</sup> to Main Stanway Hall Void/Batters
